

Program Overview



Research has repeatedly shown that letter knowledge and phonemic awareness skills are the best predictors of later literacy skills.

Once students acquire letter-sound knowledge, which often emerges from their letter-name knowledge, and they start recognizing that words are made up of individual sounds, they can closely approximate the spellings of words, and they can read words accurately by saying each sound and then blending them together.
